MARCH 2024 QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT AND APPENDIX 4C

The Board of Sports Entertainment Group Limited (SEG) is pleased to provide the following activities update for the quarter ending 31 March 2024.

<u>Key Highlights</u>

- Revenue from continuing operations of \$31.0 million was up 24% on the prior corresponding period.
- Net cash inflows for the period were \$2.9m. Inclusive of;
 - Neutral operating cashflows, attributable to the seasonality of the business.
 - \$3.7m from the successful sale of the NZ digital and audio businesses;
 - \$0.8m of the previously announced \$2.2m issue of shares at \$0.22 per share through a private placement;
 - \$0.5m from the previously announced 1.25% investment in SEN Teams.
- Group cash was \$8.0m as at 31 March 2024. Subsequent to the March 2024 quarter:
 - a further \$0.5m was received from the \$2.2m placement mentioned above with the final \$0.9m committed for receipt by the end of June 2024;
 - o a further \$0.4m of investment in SEN Teams;
 - o our focus on working capital has seen improved collections from debtors; and
 - group cash has improved to approximately \$11m (as at the date of this report).
- SEG has agreed to pay \$3m to CBA by the end of April 2024 with a further \$4.1m to be paid by 31 July 2024. This will reduce the group's debt to \$20m in line with the recently agreed three-year facility extension.
