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### Quarterly Activity Report: January – March 2024

## Highlights:

- Q3 FY24 sales of \$4.5M
- Sales subdued in line with cyclical effects of retail sector post-Christmas
- \$1.0M cash on hand and \$6.3M undrawn on financing facility
- Average gross margins continue to improve
- Continued traction in refurbished product sales
- No requirement to raise capital in the foreseeable future

Pure-Play online retailer Harris Technology Group Limited (ASX: HT8) ("Harris Technology" or "the Company") is pleased to provide its activity report for the March 2024 quarter (Q3 FY24).

#### **Operations Update**

Harris Technology generated sales revenue of \$4.5M in the March quarter in line with the lower cyclical nature of the retail sector, post-Christmas.

A net operating cash outflow of \$582K was recorded in the quarter (Q2 FY24: \$235k inflow), delivering a year-to-date operating cash outflow of \$121K.

As of 31 March 2024, inventory on hand was \$4.2M, remaining flat on the December 2023 value of \$4.1M. This included \$3.8M of purchased inventory during the March quarter, indicating continued inventory replenishment in line with anticipated demand, alongside a continued focus on higher-margin products and cash preservation.

Demand for refurbished tech products is proving positive which has seen an increase in warehouse floor space utilised by the refurbishment team. Previously owned products being sourced now include laptops, monitors, routers, servers and docking stations with gross margins outperforming new IT products.

As a Marketplace authorised reseller of refurbished tech products and a well-established supply chain, Harris Technology has potential to increase the scale of its refurbished product sales. Harris Technology also continues to generate consistent sales from the Household category which has been less impacted by the cyclical nature of the retail sector and returns higher margins.

IT Technology demand continues to be subdued in line with current economic circumstances. In line with seasonal demand reduction, Harris Technology has temporarily reduced its investment into its Manufacturer-to-Consumer divisional inventory. Harris Technology CEO, Garrison Huang commented, "We have continued to navigate the difficult retail landscape with prudent cash management. The ongoing focus on higher-margin products is improving our average margins. Having identified a good growth opportunity in refurbished tech products, we are recording increasing success in this vertical where there is lower competitive activity. Harris Technology has an advantage in this space due to our established eCommerce presence and expertise across the tech products supply chain as consumers continue demonstrating higher price sensitivity due to the macroeconomic headwinds."
